

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE.
No. 266 OF 1949.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section *ten* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges Proclamation, 1948 (No. 16 of 1948), His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to apply the provisions of sections *one, three, four, five, eight, nine* and *ten* of the above-mentioned Proclamation to and in connection with the organisations set out in the First Schedule hereto.

The privileges and immunities set out in the above-mentioned sections shall be enjoyed in the territory to the same extent as they are enjoyed in the United Kingdom. The extent to which they are enjoyed in the United Kingdom is contained in the United Kingdom Orders-in-Council set out in the Second Schedule hereto. Copies of such Orders-in-Council may be inspected by members of the public during ordinary business hours at the office of the Government Secretary, The Secretariat, Mafeking.
