PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER

Entitled The Bechuanaland Protectorate Revised Edition of the Laws (Amendment) Proclamation, 1949.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Revised Edition of the Laws Proclamation, 1939 (No. 13 of 1939), as amended (hereinafter styled the principal law):

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Section *four* of the principal law is hereby repealed and replaced by the following:—

“ 4. The Commissioner shall omit from the revised edition the laws set out in the Schedule hereto:

Provided that anything in this Proclamation to the contrary notwithstanding, the said laws shall remain in force in the Bechuanaland Protectorate until they have been expressly repealed.”

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Revised Edition of the Laws (Amendment) Proclamation, 1949, and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

1. The Acts of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope which were in force in the Bechuanaland Protectorate on the first day of January, 1948, by virtue of Proclamation No. 36 of 1909.

2. All laws or parts of laws which deal solely with the rates of customs duty to be collected or with remissions, rebates or refunds of customs duty.

3. All laws or parts of laws which deal solely with the rates of postage.

4. All notices appointing officers or officials or constituting Boards or Courts, or conferring powers on a person or persons.
