

## BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE:

No. 47 of 1949.

(Promulgated 18th November, 1949.)

### PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER

Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate British Nationality  
(Special Provisions) Proclamation, 1949.

Whereas the British Nationality Act, 1948, of the Imperial Parliament and the British Nationality Regulations, 1948, enacted under that Act in the United Kingdom are generally applicable in the Territory; and

Whereas section *twenty-eight* of the British Nationality Act, 1948, and regulation *nineteen* together with the Seventh Schedule of the British Nationality Regulations, 1948, apply only in the United Kingdom;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. The fees in respect of any application made under the British Nationality Act, 1948, or in respect of any registration or the making of any declaration or the grant of any certificate or the taking of any oath of allegiance authorised to be made, granted or taken by or under such Act or in respect of supplying a certified or other copy of any notice, certificate, order, declaration or entry, given, granted or made as aforesaid, shall be those set out in the Schedule to this Proclamation:

Provided that the High Commissioner may by notice in the *Gazette* vary, alter or amend any such fees.

2. (1) Any person who for the purposes of anything to be done or not to be done under the British Nationality Act, 1948, makes any statement which he knows to be false in a material particular, or recklessly makes any statement which is false in a material particular, shall be liable on conviction before a subordinate court of the first class to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding three months.

Offences.

(2) Any person who fails to comply with any requirement imposed on him by regulations made under the British Nationality Act, 1948, with respect to the delivery of certificates of naturalisation shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding three months.

Short title. 3. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate British Nationality (Supplementary Provisions) Proclamation, 1949.
