HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE
No. 233 OF 1950.

RADIO REGULATIONS (AMENDMENT).

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by section *two* of the Basutoland Radio Proclamation, 1927 (No. 5 of 1927), section *two* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Radio Proclamation, 1927 (No. 10 of 1927), and section *two* of the Swaziland Radio Proclamation, 1927 (No. 6 of 1927), His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to cancel High Commissioner's Notices Nos. 58, 59 and 60 of 1935 and to amend Regulation 18 of the Radio Regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 233 of 1942 in the following respects:—

1. By deleting the words "Broadcasting Station" wherever they occur and substituting therefor the words "Main Broadcasting Centre".

2. By adding after paragraph (*b*) of the said regulation the following:—

"(c) For the purposes of these regulations the following will be regarded as main broadcasting centres:—

Johannesburg (Maraisburg).

Johannesburg (Springs).

Pretoria (Silverton).

Cape Town.

Durban.

Bloemfontein.

Port Elizabeth.

Grahamstown.

(d) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in these regulations, listeners' licences may, with the approval of the High Commissioner, be issued free of charge to—

(i) educational institutions approved by the Board of Governors of the South African Broadcasting Corporation, provided that the receiving sets are used solely for educational purposes and are installed in a classroom for this purpose:

- (ii) public hospitals;
- (iii) charitable institutions recognised and approved by the Board of Governors of the South African Broadcasting Corporation as such;

Provided that the granting of any such licence to any of the said persons shall be in the entire discretion of the Resident Commissioner.

- (e) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in these regulations, listeners' licences may be issued to the following persons on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence) per annum—

- (i) blind persons whose applications for such licences are supported by recommendations from societies for the care of the blind, approved for that purpose by the Resident Commissioner;
- (ii) indigent invalids whose circumstances are deemed by the Resident Commissioner to be such as to warrant the grant of a 2s. 6d. licence;

Provided that the granting of any such licence to any of the said persons shall be in the entire discretion of the Resident Commissioner.

- (f) In special circumstances, listeners' licences shall be issued on the payment of such fees as the High Commissioner may prescribe."
