

## BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

### PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER  
Entitled the Public Service (Bechuanaland Protectorate)  
(Amendment) Proclamation, 1950.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Public Service (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation, 1924 (No. 32 of 1924), hereinafter referred to as "the principal law";

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

#### **Amendment of Section 7 of Proclamation No. 32 of 1924.**

1. Section *seven* of the principal law is hereby repealed and replaced by the following new section:—

"7. (1) The High Commissioner may from time to time issue orders and may alter and revoke such orders on all matters relating to the Public Service and for the efficient conduct thereof. Such orders shall be conveyed to the members of the Public Service through the medium of High Commission Territories General Orders or by means of such circular instructions as may in the opinion of the High Commissioner be appropriate.

Provided that all existing regulations made by notice in the *Gazette* under the provisions of this section hereby repealed shall be deemed to remain in force until cancelled by notice in the *Gazette*.

(2) The regulations of His Majesty's Colonial Service known and referred to as the Colonial Regulations shall *mutatis mutandis* and in so far as they may be applicable, apply to all members of the Public Service of the Bechuanaland Protectorate or in the employment of the Government of the Bechuanaland Protectorate except in so far as they may be altered or revoked by orders issued by the High Commissioner in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (1) of this section."

**Short Title and Commencement.**

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Public Service (Bechuanaland Protectorate) (Amendment) Proclamation, 1950, and shall have force and take effect from the first day of April, 1950.
