

## BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

### PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER  
Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate General Interpretation (Amendment) Proclamation, 1950.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate General Interpretation Proclamation, 1942 (No. 13 of 1942), hereinafter called "the principal law";

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

#### Amendment of Section 1 of Proclamation No. 13 of 1942.

1. Section *one* of the principal law is hereby amended—

(1) by deleting the definition of the words "Administrative Officer" and substituting therefor the following:—

"'Administrative Officer' means a District Officer or an Assistant District Officer or an Assistant District Officer (Cadet);"

(2) by the insertion of the following new definition to be numbered (7)<sub>A</sub>:—

"'District Commissioner' means the Administrative Officer gazetted as the officer in charge of the district."

#### Short Title and Commencement.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate General Interpretation (Amendment) Proclamation, 1950, and shall have force and take effect from the first day of April, 1950.
