PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER
Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate Subordinate
Courts (Amendment) Proclamation, 1950.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Subordinate Courts Proclamation, 1938 (No. 51 of 1938), hereinafter referred to as "the principal law";

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

Amendment of Section 2 of Proclamation No. 51 of 1938.

1. Section *two* of the principal law is hereby repealed and replaced by the following new section:—

"2. There shall be and are hereby constituted Courts subordinate to the High Court to be known as 'Subordinate Courts' as follows, namely:—

(1) Courts of a District Officer whether gazetted as a District Commissioner or not to be called Subordinate Courts of the First Class;

(2) Courts of an Assistant District Officer to be called Subordinate Courts of the Second Class;

(3) Courts of an Assistant District Officer (Cadet) to be called Subordinate Courts of the Third Class."

Short Title and Commencement.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Subordinate Courts (Amendment) Proclamation, 1950, and shall have force and take effect from the first day of April, 1950.
