PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER
Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate Native Graded
Taxation (Amendment) Proclamation, 1950.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Native Graded Taxation Proclamation, 1949 (No. 16 of 1949), hereinafter called "the principal law";

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

Amendment of Section 9 of Proclamation No. 16 of 1949.

1. Section *nine* of the principal law shall be and is hereby amended by substituting the words "any member of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Police" for the words "any Police Officer" and by the addition at the end of the section of the following words "or at a Police Station within seven days of such demand".

Amendment of Section 10 of Proclamation No. 16 of 1949.

2. Section *ten* of the principal law shall be and is hereby amended by adding a further sub-section to be numbered (6) as follows:—

"(6) Any native who in contravention of section *nine* fails to produce his tax receipt shall be guilty of an offence and on conviction shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds or in default of payment to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a period not exceeding one month."

Short Title.

3. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Native Graded Taxation (Amendment) Proclamation, 1950.
