**THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (DISTRICT COUNCILS) LAW, 1965
ESTABLISHMENT OF THE CENTRAL DISTRICT COUNCIL
ORDER, 1966**

(Published 29th April, 1966)

In exercise of the power vested in him by section 4 of the Local Government (District Councils) Law, 1965 (No. 35 of 1965) His Excellency Her Majesty's Commissioner hereby makes the following Order —

Title.

1. This Order may be cited as the Establishment of the Central District Council Order, 1966.

Constitution and Establishment of the Central District Council with effect from July, 1st, 1966 (hereinafter referred to as the appointed day)

2. (1) there shall be a district council, to be known as the Central District Council, in respect of the area specified in the First Schedule.

(2) The Central District Council shall consist of —

- (a) a Chairman;
- (b) 32 elected members; and
- (c) 5 nominated members.

(3) The Chairman of the Central District Council shall be Leapeetswe Khama, Esquire.

(4) The elected members of the Central District Council shall be elected in the manner provided by the Local Government (Conduct of Elections) Regulations, 1966, each polling district within the Council area returning one member.

(5) The nominated members of the Central District Council shall be appointed by the Minister by writing under his hand.

(6) For the purposes of this Order "polling district" means a polling district established under Regulation 4 of the Legislative Assembly (Registration of Voters) Regulations, 1964, (as amended).

First Elected Member of the Central District Council.

3. An election may be held in pursuance of regulation 5 of the Local Government (Conduct of Elections) Regulations, 1966, for the purpose of electing the first elected members of the Council, before the appointed day, but the persons elected at such election shall not be deemed to be members of the Council until the appointed day.

First Nominated Member of the Central District Council.

4. The Minister may appoint the first nominated members of the Council, in pursuance of section 2 (5) of this order, before the appointed day, but the persons appointed in such manner shall not be deemed to be members of the Council until the appointed day.

Persons not Disqualified for Membership of Council.

5. No person shall be deemed to possess the disqualifications for membership of the Council referred to in section 7 of the Law merely because he has applied for and been granted a passport issued by or under the authority of the Government of any of the countries specified in the Second Schedule.

Filling of Vacancies.

6. If the seat of a member of the Council becomes vacant by virtue of any provisions of the Law the vacancy thus caused shall be filled in the case of —

- (a) a seat occupied by an elected member, as in Section 2(4) of this order ;
- (b) a seat occupied by a nominated member, as in Section 2(5) of this order.

Functions to be Performed by the Council.

7. The Council shall perform the functions set out in Section 1 of the Schedule to the Law and may perform any or all of the remaining functions set out in the said Schedule to the Law.

FIRST SCHEDULE

(Section 2 (1))

The area of the Central District Council shall be

The Ngwato District as defined in the Schedule to High Commissioner's Notice No. 61 of 1961, together with the Nata Crown Land, as defined in paragraph (b) of the said definition of the Francistown District and the Tuli Block, as defined in the Second Schedule of the British South Africa Company Land Proclamation (Cap. 104).
