**A LAW TO AMEND THE FAUNA CONSERVATION
PROCLAMATION 1961**

(23rd September, 1966)

ENACTED by the Legislature of Bechuanaland.

Short Title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Fauna Conservation (Amendment) Law, 1966.

Amendment of Section 2 of Proclamation 22 of 1961.

2. Section 2 of the Fauna Conservation Proclamation 1961 (hereinafter referred to as the principal law) is amended in subsection (1) by the insertion of the following definition —

“ “tribe” and “tribal territory” have the same meaning as in the Chieftainship Law, 1965 (No. 29 of 1965); ”.

Amendment of Section 4 of Proclamation 22 of 1961.

3. Section 4 of the principal law is amended by the deletion of subsection (1) and the substitution of —

“ (1) Section 14 and Part III shall not apply to any members of any tribe when hunting on the tribal territory of such tribe in accordance with such restrictions or conditions as may be prescribed after consultation with the Chief of that tribal territory and the appropriate District Council. ” ;

and in subsection (2) by the deletion of “terms and ” and the substitution of “restrictions or”.

Amendment of Section 50 of Proclamation 22 of 1961.

4. Section 50 of the principal law is amended by the addition, at the end, of “and if given in accordance with the advice of the appropriate District Council”.

Amendment of Section 62 of Proclamation 22 of 1961.

5. Section 62 of the principal law is amended by the deletion of subsection (1).

Amendment of section 65 of Proclamation 22 of 1961.

6. Section 65 of the principal law is amended by the deletion of subsection (1).

Amendment of References to “African Authority” in Proclamation 22 of 1961.

7. The principal law is further amended by the deletion of “African Authority” wherever this expression occurs and the substitution of “Chief”.
