BRITISH NATIONALITY

The British Nationality (No. 2) Regulations 1965

Made 16th November 1965
Coming into Operation ... 18th November 1965

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 29(1) of the British Nationality Act 1948^(a), I hereby make the following Regulations:—

Application for Registration Under Section 12(6) of the British Nationality Act 1948 Made by a Citizen of Southern Rhodesia.

1. An application for registration as a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies under section 12(6) of the British Nationality Act 1948 made by a citizen of Southern Rhodesia by virtue of the Southern Rhodesia (British Nationality Act 1948) Order 1965^(b) shall be made to the appropriate authority specified in the next following Regulation in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

Authority to Whom Application is to be Made.

2. Such an application as aforesaid shall be made —

- (a) if the applicant is resident in a country mentioned in section 1(3) of the British Nationality Act 1948 in which there is a High Commissioner to the High Commissioner;

(b) S.I. 1965/1957

(b) in any other case to the Secretary of State at the Home Office.

Place of Registration.

3. The registration of a person as a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies in pursuance of such an application as aforesaid shall be effected at such place as the person to whom the application is made may direct.

Variation of Application Form.

4. The requirement that such an application as aforesaid shall be made in the form set out in the Schedule hereto shall be treated as satisfied if it is made —

(a) in a form to the like effect; or

(b) in a form authorised by the Secretary of State or the High Commissioner to whom the application is made, if in his opinion the form set out in the Schedule hereto is unsuitable in the circumstances of a particular case.

Interpretation.

5. (1) In these Regulations a reference to any enactment is a reference to that enactment as amended or extended by any subsequent enactment.

(2) In these Regulations the expression "the High Commissioner" means, in relation to a country mentioned in section 1(3) of the British Nationality Act 1948, the High Commissioner for Her Majesty's government in the United Kingdom in that country, and includes the acting High Commissioner in that country.

Citation and Commencement.

6. These Regulations may be cited as the British Nationality (No. 2) Regulations 1965 and shall come into operation on 18th November 1965.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations relate to applications for registration as a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies under section 12(6) of the British Nationality Act 1948 (as amended by section 3(1) of the British Nationality Act 1958) made by citizens of Southern Rhodesia by virtue of the Southern Rhodesia (British Nationality Act 1948) Order 1965.

Articles 1 and 4 relate to the form of such an application, Article 2 to the authority to whom application is to be made and Article 3 to the place where registration is to be effected.
