**THE FAUNA CONSERVATION PROCLAMATION (AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULES)
NOTICE, 1968**

In the exercise of the powers vested in him by sections 12, 26 and 59 of the Fauna Conservation Proclamation, 1961, the Minister of Commerce, Industry and Water Affairs hereby gives notice as follows ---

Citation and Commencement

1. This Notice may be cited as the Fauna Conservation Proclamation (Amendment of Schedules) Notice, 1968, and shall come into operation upon the commencement of the Fauna Conservation (Amendment) Act, 1967.

Replacement of Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Schedules of Proclamation No. 22 of 1961

2. The Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Schedules of the Fauna Conservation Proclamation, 1961 (hereinafter referred to as the principal law) are deleted and the following Schedules are substituted ---

FIFTH SCHEDULE

(Sections 18, 19, 20A, 29 and 66)

LICENCE FEES AND PERIODS

Periods

A bird licence issued to a Resident shall be issued for a year.

A bird licence issued to a Non-Resident may be issued for 7 days, a month or a year.

A general game licence may be issued for 7 days or a season.

No person may be issued with more than four 7 -days general game licences in any one open season.

No person issued with a season general game licence may be issued with any other season general game licence for the same season.

No person issued with a season general game licence may be issued with more than one 7-day general licence during the same season.

(N.B. In terms of subsection (5) of section 19 of the Proclamation, the 7-day licence may only be issued in respect of an area which is not included within the area for which the season general game licence is issued).
