**THE IMMIGRATION (CONSOLIDATION) LAW, 1966**

**THE IMMIGRATION (CONSOLIDATION) REGULATIONS, 1968**

(Published on 15th November, 1968)

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 31 of the Immigration (Consolidation) Law, 1966 (No. 19 of 1966), His Excellency the President hereby makes the following regulations —

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**PART I**  
**PRELIMINARY**

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Immigration (Consolidation) Regulations, 1968.

**Interpretation**

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires —

“Form” means form prescribed in the Schedule;

“the principal law” means the Immigration (Consolidation) Law, 1966 (No. 19 of 1966).

**PART II**  
**IMMIGRATION PROCEDURE**

**Immigrant May be Required to Complete Declaration, etc.**

3. Any person presenting himself to an immigration officer in terms of section 6 of the principal law may be required either to complete a declaration in Form 1 or to furnish to the immigration officer such information as is necessary to enable such a declaration to be completed by the immigration officer in respect of such person.

**How Medical Practitioner to Report Result of Examination to Immigration Officer**

4. Where an immigration officer has, in terms of section 6(3)(c) of the principal law, ordered any person to submit to an examination by a medical practitioner, the medical practitioner shall report the result of such examination to the immigration officer in Form 2.

**Notice to Person Entering Botswana**

5. An immigration officer may deliver to any person entering Botswana, or to any non-resident within Botswana, a notice in Form 3.

**PART III**  
**PROHIBITED IMMIGRANTS**

**Prescribed Diseases, etc.**

6. (1) The following diseases shall be prescribed diseases for the purposes of section 8 of the principal law —

Favus  
Framboesia or Yaws  
Leprosy  
Scabies  
Syphilis  
Trachoma  
Tuberculosis.

(2) Where an immigration control officer gives a written authority to any person who is afflicted with or suffering from a disease referred to in sub-regulation (1) to enter and remain in Botswana, he shall do so in Form 4.

(3) Any authority referred to in sub-regulation (2) may contain conditions —

- (a) defining or restricting the place or places at which the holder may live;
- (b) regulating the manner in which the holder may travel;
- (c) setting out the precautions to be carried out and the treatment to be undertaken by the holder to prevent the spread of disease;
- (d) detailing the medical examination to be undergone by the holder and the manner in which the cost of such examinations shall be defrayed.

**Form of Notice to Person Declared to be a Prohibited Immigrant**

7. A notice required to be given in terms of section 12(1) of the principal law shall be in Form 5.

**Form of Appeal**

8. An appeal in terms of section 12(2) of the principal law shall be noted in Form 6.

**Warrant of Detention**

9. Where an immigration officer has, in terms of section 11 or section 15 of the principal law, ordered the detention of any person he shall complete a warrant of detention in Form 7 in respect of such person and forward it to the officer-in-charge of the prison or other place in which such person is to be detained.

**Authority to Police Officer to Remove Prohibited Immigrant from Botswana**

10. An authority by an immigration officer for the removal of a prohibited immigrant from Botswana by a police officer in terms of section 14(1) of the principal law shall be in Form 8.

**PART IV**

**RESIDENCE PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES  
OF IDENTITY**

**Application for a Residence Permit**

11. An application in terms of section 21(1) of the principal law shall be in Form 9 and shall be accompanied by the documents therein described.

**Residence Permit**

12. (1) A residence permit issued in terms of section 21(8) of the principal law shall be in Form 10.

(2) A residence permit issued in terms of section 21(7) of the principal law shall be in Form 11.

(3) The fee payable in respect of a residence permit shall be R4.00.

(4) No fee shall be payable in respect of a residence permit issued to an applicant's wife or child under 18 years of age, aged parent or grandparent under the provisions of section 21(5) of the principal law.

(5) No fee shall be payable in respect of a residence permit issued under the instructions of the Minister under the provisions of section 21(7) of the principal law.

(6) The fee payable in respect of the renewal of a residence permit in terms of section 21(10) of the principal law shall be R1.00.

(7) The Minister may, where in his opinion special circumstances exist, direct that any fee payable under this regulation shall be waived.

#### **Cancellation of Residence Permits**

13. When the Minister has cancelled a residence permit under the provisions of section 22(1) of the principal law, the notice shall be in Form 12.

#### **Certificates of Identity**

14. (1) A certificate of identity issued in terms of section 18 of the principal law shall be in Form 13.

(2) The fee payable in respect of such a certificate shall be R2.00.

#### **Copies of Documents Lost or Destroyed**

15. If any document issued in terms of these regulations is lost or destroyed, the Immigration Officer may in his discretion issue a copy thereof.

### **PART V**

#### **SECURITY DEPOSITS IN CERTAIN CASES FOR DEFRAYING EXPENSES**

#### **Immigrant May be Required to Deposit Security**

16. (1) Any person may as a condition precedent to the issue of a residence permit under section 21 of the law, be required by the Immigrants Selection Board to deposit with the Immigration Office a sum not exceeding R1,000 in respect of such residence permit so issued, and any such deposit may, if necessary, be used for the purpose of defraying any expenses incurred by the Government of Botswana in connexion with the maintenance or repatriation of the person in respect of whom the residence permit has been issued and his dependants, if any:

Provided that no person in respect of whom security has been given under sub-regulation (3) shall be required to give security under this regulation.

(2) A deposit made under the provisions of sub-regulation (1) shall, unless the person in respect of whom the residence permit has been issued is ordered to leave, or is deported from Botswana and the money so deposited is used for the purpose of maintaining or repatriating such person and his dependants, if any, be refunded to the depositor at such time and place as the Immigration Officer shall order, if he is satisfied that —

- (a) the person in respect of whom the deposit was made and his dependants, if any, are leaving Botswana permanently; or
- (b) the person in respect of whom the deposit was made is domiciled in Botswana in terms of section 3 of the law.

(3) The Immigrants Selection Board may, in lieu of requiring a deposit under the provisions of sub-regulation (1), require an applicant for a residence permit or some other person in his behalf, to give security with or without sureties in a sum not exceeding R1,000 by way of bond.

#### **Employer May be Required to Deposit Security**

17. Where any employer from time to time enters into contracts for the employment within Botswana of persons from outside Botswana, the Immigrants Selection Board may

require such employer as a condition precedent to the issue to any such person of a residence permit, to give a general security in respect of all such persons, such security not to exceed R1,000 in respect of each such employee and his dependants, if any.

**Prescribed Forms**

18. (1) The security given in terms of regulation 16(3) shall be in Form 14.
- (2) The security given in terms of regulation 17 shall be in Form 15.

**PART VI**

**REVOCATION OF PREVIOUS REGULATIONS**

**Revocation**

19. The Immigration Regulations, 1965 (as published under Legal Notice No. 19 of 1965) are hereby revoked.

**NOTE:** Section 12 of the Immigration (Consolidation) Law, 1966, as amended by Act No. 19 of 1967, reads as follows:

12. (1) Whenever on examination of any person under section 6 or otherwise an immigration officer determines that any person is a prohibited immigrant notice that he is a prohibited immigrant notice of the grounds therefor shall be given by the immigration officer in the prescribed form to that person.

(2) Subject to the provisions of subsection (6), every person to whom notice is given under subsection (1) that he is a prohibited immigrant, may appeal therefrom to the nearest magistrate's court. Any such appeal shall be noted within three days after such notice has been given.

(3) Pending the hearing of any such appeal, such person shall not be removed from Botswana, but the provisions of section 15 shall apply in relation to that person as if he was being removed.

(4) A magistrate's court may, of its own motion or at the request of the appellant or of an immigration officer, reserve for the decision of a judge of the High Court any question of law which arises upon an appeal heard before such magistrate's court, and shall state the question in the form of a special case for the opinion of the court by transmitting that special case to the registrar thereof. For the purposes of this subsection, a question of law includes a question of domicile.

(5) A question stated in the manner described in subsection (4) may be heard by and argued before a judge of the High Court at any convenient time, and that judge may call for further information to be supplied by the magistrate if he deems such information necessary, and may give such answer on the case, supplemented by the costs of the proceedings, as he may think fit.

(6) No appeal shall lie under subsection (2) against any notice that a person is a prohibited immigrant by reason of any declaration by the President under paragraph (f) of section 8, and no court shall question the adequacy of the grounds for any such declaration.

    - (b) A birth certificate or a certified copy thereof in respect of each applicant. If the applicant is unable to provide such proof of birth a statement setting out the reasons therefor must be attached.
    - (c) If married a marriage certificate or a certified copy thereof. If the applicant is unable to provide such proof of marriage a statement setting out the reason therefor must be attached.
    - (d) If legally separated or divorced a copy of the Court Order in question, certified as being correct by an official of the Court which made it.
    - (e) A medical report for each applicant in the form set out in the Schedule to the Immigration (Consolidation) Regulations, 1968.
    - (f) Certified copies of certificates of character from present employer, or minister of religion or bank official or any judicial officer.
    - (g) Such other documents as in the special circumstances of the applicant are required to be attached by question 17.

- (a) If the holder does not take up residence in Botswana within six months of the date of the issue of the permit.
  - (b) If the holder of the permit absents himself from Botswana for a longer continuous period than six months.

- (c) If the holder or his agent is convicted of any offence under section twenty-seven of the law in connection with the application for the issue or the renewal of this permit.
- (d) If the holder is convicted of an offence under subsection (12) of section twenty-one of the law.
- (e) If the holder, having attained the age of eighteen years is convicted of any other offence punishable with imprisonment and the court by which he is convicted or any court to which a case is brought by way of appeal against conviction or sentence, recommends that the permit be cancelled.
- (f) If the President is satisfied that the object for which the permit was issued or renewed has been completed or no longer exists, or that it is no longer in the interest of Botswana that the holder should have such a permit.
