**THE FAUNA CONSERVATION PROCLAMATION,
1961**

DECLARATION OF MAUN GAME SANCTUARY

(Published on 9th May, 1969)

In the exercise of the powers vested in him by section 6 of the Fauna Conservation Proclamation, 1961 (No. 22 of 1961), His Excellency the President declares the area of land described in the Schedule to be a game sanctuary in respect of all animals.

SCHEDULE

Commencing at the junction of the middle of the Thamalakane River with the middle of the Boro River the boundary runs south-eastwards to a point in the middle of the old Maun to Bushman Pits Road, the geographical co-ordinates of which point are approximate latitude $19^{\circ} 55' 30''$ South, approximate longitude $23^{\circ} 31' 30''$ East; thence south-westwards for a distance of approximately 13 miles to a point one and one half miles south-east of the confluence of the Shashi and Thamalakane Rivers, the geographical co-ordinates of which point are approximate latitude $20^{\circ} 03' 45''$ South, approximate longitude $23^{\circ} 23' 15''$ East; thence north-westwards to the junction of the middle of the Thamalakane River with the middle of the Shashi River; thence northwards along the middle of the Shashi River for a distance of three miles; thence north-eastwards for a distance of approximately ten decimal point two miles to a point in the middle of the Boro River two miles upstream from the junction of the middle of the Thamalakane River with the middle of the Boro River; thence south-eastwards along the middle of the Boro River to the point of commencement.
