THE STOCK DISEASES PROCLAMATION (CHAPTER 131)

THE DISEASES OF STOCK (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1969

(Published on the 10th January, 1969)

In the exercise of the powers vested in him by section 2 of the Stock Diseases Proclamation (Chapter 131), His Excellency the President makes the following Regulations —

Citation

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Diseases of Stock (Amendment) Regulations, 1969.

Amendment of High Commissioner's Notice No. 28 of 1926

2. The Diseases of Stock Regulations contained in High Commissioner's Notice No. 28 of 1926 are amended —

(a) by the deletion of paragraph (c) of Regulation 2 and the substitution thereof of —

“(c) breeding diseases, i.e. brucellosis, vibriosis, trichomoniasis and epidelymitis vaginitis;”;

(b) by the deletion of Regulation 75 and the substitution thereof of —

“75- The following additional provisions will apply in the case of breeding diseases:

(a) In the case of an outbreak of breeding disease occurring amongst stock, all animals infected or suspected of being infected shall be isolated and dealt with in a manner prescribed by the Director of Veterinary Services.

(b) All stock which may have been in contact with an animal infected with a breeding disease shall be dealt with in a manner prescribed by the Director of Veterinary Services.

(c) No person shall sell or otherwise dispose of stock which are infected or believed to be infected with a breeding disease unless the purchaser has received written notification of the stock's condition at the time of sale and the seller has obtained written permission from the Director of Veterinary Services to sell the stock.”
