**THE ELECTORAL FORMS AMENDMENT NOTICE, 1969**

(Published on 29th August, 1969)

In the exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 151 of the Electoral Act, 1968 (No. 38 of 1968), and all other powers thereunto him enabling, the Minister of Home Affairs gives the following Notice —

**Citation**

1. This Notice may be cited as the Electoral Forms Amendment Notice, 1969.

**Amendment of Form N in First Schedule to Act No. 38 of 1968**

2. Form N in the First Schedule to the Electoral Act, 1968, is amended by the deletion of paragraph 5 thereof and by the substitution therefor of a new paragraph as follows —

“5. Every candidate must

- (i) either before his nomination paper is delivered to me deposit or cause to be deposited in any convenient Government revenue office the sum of twenty rands in cash and at the time of delivery of his nomination paper produce or cause to be produced to me the official receipt for that sum or at the time of delivery of his nomination paper deposit or cause to be deposited with me the sum of twenty rands in cash; and
- (ii) at the time of delivery of his nomination paper produce or cause to be produced to me his certificate of proficiency in English as issued in terms of section 35 of the Electoral Act;

and no nomination shall be valid unless such deposit has been made (and, in the case of a deposit made at a Government revenue office the receipt therefor is produced to me) and the certificate of competency produced to me”.
