

THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT ACT, 1968

**THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT (LIQUORS) PROTECTION
ORDER, 1969**

(Published on 21st March, 1969)

In the exercise of the powers vested in him by section 12 of the Industrial Development Act, 1968 (No. 22 of 1968), His Excellency the President, being satisfied after an inquiry conducted under the provisions of section 9 of the said Act that it is in the public interest and in the interests of the efficient development of the liquor industry to grant protection to the undermentioned manufacturer which has asked for protection in accordance with section 7, and to which the Minister has decided to grant a licence under section 11, of the said Act, makes the following Order —

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Industrial Development (Liquors) Protection Order, 1969.

Protection of Botswana Liquor Manufacturers (Proprietary) Limited

2. Protection is granted to Botswana Liquor Manufacturers (Proprietary) Limited by the exclusion in the whole of Botswana for a period of three years from the date of publication of this Order of all manufacture, other than manufacture by the said Company, of brandies, gin, vodka, ouzo, cane spirit and the liqueurs called brandy liqueur, peppermint, maraschino, vanderhum and triple sec.

Conditions of Protection

3. The protection hereby granted is granted on condition —

- (a) that the said Company supply in the first year of its operations at least 10 per cent in quantity of the aggregate domestic demand for potable spirits of the type specified in paragraph 2, in the second year of its operations 15 per cent thereof, and in the third year of its operations 25 per cent; and
- (b) that the said Company in the course of each of the first three years of its operations provide to the satisfaction of the Minister of Commerce, Industry and Water Affairs, evidence that Botswana are being trained to occupy positions of responsibility in the Company.
