**THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT (PAINTS, VARNISHES,  
ENAMELS AND DISTEMPERS) PROTECTION ORDER, 1969**

(Published on the 9th May, 1969)

In the exercise of the powers vested in him by section 12 of the Industrial Development Act, 1968 (No. 22 of 1968), His Excellency the President, being satisfied after an inquiry conducted under the provisions of section 9 of the said Act that it is in the public interest and in the interests of the efficient development of the paint industry to grant protection to the undermentioned manufacturer which has asked for protection in accordance with section 7, and to which the Minister has decided to grant a licence under section 11, of the said Act, makes the following Order —

**Citation**

1. This Order may be cited as the Industrial Development (Paints, Varnishes, Enamels and Distempers) Protection Order, 1969.

**Protection of Botswana Paint Manufacturers (Proprietary) Limited**

2. Protection is granted to Botswana Paint Manufacturers (Proprietary) Limited by the exclusion in the whole of Botswana for a period of one year from the date of publication of this Order of all manufacture, other than manufacture by the said Company, of the following:-

| <i>Emulsion<br/>Paints:</i> | Synthetic resin or oil base including polyvinylproprionate, polyvinyl-<br>lacetate, polyacrylates, homopolymers or copolymus enamel, gloss,<br>eggshell or flat finish ; |
| <i>Varnishes:</i>           | Oil, resin or synthetic resin base, coloured or clear, gloss or matt ;   |
| <i>Enamels:</i>             | Oil varnish, synthetic resin or emulsion base, high glosseggshell or<br>matt finish ;  |
| <i>Distempers:</i>          | Oil or synthetic resin bound, powder or paste, lime washes.  |
