

**Statutory Instrument No. 123 of 1969**

**THE PRICE CONTROL LAW, 1962  
THE PRICE CONTROL (RETAIL SUGAR PRICES)  
REGULATIONS, 1969**

(Published on the 19th December, 1969)

In the exercise of the powers vested in him by section 3 of the Price Control Law, 1962 (No. 26 of 1962), as read with sections 4(2) and 17(1) of the Botswana Independence Order, 1966, His Excellency the President makes the following regulations —

**Citation**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Price Control (Retail Sugar Prices) Regulations, 1969.

**Retail Prices of Sugar**

2. A person shall not sell sugar by retail either personally or through an agent at a price which exceeds the price at which such sugar has been sold to such person —

- (a) by more than 15 per cent when such sale takes place three miles or less from a railway station;
- (b) by more than 20 per cent in any case not covered by paragraph (a).

**Books etc. to be produced**

3. Any person carrying on any business which includes the sale of sugar by retail shall, on being called upon to do so by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Water Affairs, immediately produce to the said Permanent Secretary all books, accounts and other documents in his possession relating to the purchase and retail sale of sugar during the immediately preceding period of twelve months.

**Offences**

4. Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable, on conviction, to a fine of R200.00 or, in default of payment, imprisonment for six months or to both such fine and such imprisonment.
