THE POST OFFICE PROCLAMATION, 1961

**THE TELEPHONE, RADIO, POSTAL AND FRANKING (AMENDMENT)
REGULATIONS, 1969**

(Published on 30th May, 1969)

In the exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Post Office Proclamation, 1961 (No. 43 of 1961), the Director of Posts and Telegraphs, with the approval of the Minister of Works and Communications, makes the following regulations —

Citation and Commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Telephone, Radio, Postal and Franking (Amendment) Regulations, 1969, and shall come into operation on the 1st June, 1969.

Amendment of Regulation 10 A in High Commissioner's Notice No. 23 of 1963

2. Regulation 10 A of the Telephone, Radio, Postal and Franking Regulations, 1963 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations) is amended by the deletion of "2½" and the substitution of "3".

Substitution of Regulation 12 in High Commissioner's Notice No. 23 of 1963

3. Regulation 12 of the principal regulations is deleted and the following is substituted therefor —

"Internal trunk line calls

12. The charges for trunk line calls shall be as follows —

Amendment of Regulation 13 in High Commissioner's Notice No. 23 of 1963

4. Regulation 13 of the principal regulations is amended by the addition of the following subregulation, the existing regulation becoming subregulation (1) —

" (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subregulation (1), the periods given below shall apply to trunk calls which are registered as local call units in accordance with the repeat metering method. The charges for calls from subscribers' telephones shall be included in the amounts due for metered call units. —
