THE TRADITIONAL BEER (LEVY) ACT, 1968

**THE TRADITIONAL BEER (LEVY) (SOUTH EAST
DISTRICT) NOTICE, 1969**

(Published on 28th February, 1969)

In the exercise of the powers vested in it by section 3 of the Traditional Beer (Levy) Act, 1968, the South East District Council (hereinafter referred to as the Council) gives the following notice —

Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the Traditional Beer (Levy) (South East District) Notice, 1969.

Imposition of Levy

2. The Council, with the approval of the Minister of Local Government and Lands, hereby imposes a levy upon the sale by manufacturers of traditional beer, the delivery of which to purchasers occurs within the Council's area of jurisdiction.

Amount of Levy

3. The amount of the said levy shall be two cents per gallon.

Assessment of Quantities of Traditional Beer

4. All manufacturers selling traditional beer within the Council's area of jurisdiction shall submit to the District Council Secretary monthly returns showing the amount of sales of traditional beer delivered within the said area, which returns shall specify separately each individual sale and shall be supported by individual invoices or delivery notes in respect of each and every sale of traditional beer so delivered giving prices, names of purchasers and places of delivery.

Payment of Levy

5. The returns to be submitted monthly as in the last preceding paragraph provided shall be accompanied by a cheque payable free of exchange in Ramoutsa to the Council in respect of the amount of levy due.

Date for Payment

6. The returns and cheque in the last preceding paragraph referred to shall be submitted not later than the fifteenth day of the month following the month in which the sales shown in the returns are effected.
