AN ACT TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE NUMBER OF JUSTICES OF APPEAL AND TO VALIDATE APPOINTMENTS OF JUSTICES OF APPEAL PREVIOUSLY MADE.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Botswana.

1. This Act may be cited as the Justices of Appeal (Number) Act, 1971. Short title

2. For the purpose of section 100 (2) of the Constitution the number of Justices of Appeal shall be three. Number of Justices of Appeal

3. Every appointment of a Justice of Appeal made by the President, upon the advice of the Judicial Service Commission, before the coming into force of this Act shall be deemed to have been validly made notwithstanding that at the time of such appointment the number of Justices of Appeal had not been prescribed by Parliament.
