FAUNA CONSERVATION PROCLAMATION, 1961
(22 of 1961)

**FAUNA CONSERVATION (BATAWANA TRIBAL TERRITORY) HUNTING
(AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1971**

(Published on the 8th April, 1971)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Fauna Conservation Proclamation, 1961 and after consultation with the Chief of the Batawana Tribal Territory and the appropriate District Council, the Minister of Commerce, Industry and Water Affairs has made the following regulations —

1. These regulations may be cited as the Fauna Conservation (Batawana Tribal Territory) Hunting (Amendment) Regulations, 1971. Citation
2. Regulation 9 of the Fauna Conservation (Batawana Tribal Territory) Hunting Regulations, 1967 (hereinafter called the principal regulations) is amended — Amendment of reg. 9 of S.I.65/1967
 - (i) in subregulation (1) by the deletion of the proviso thereto and the substitution of a fullstop for the colon appearing immediately after the word “thereof”; and
 - (ii) in subregulation (3) by the deletion of the words “, and shall be in respect of either animals listed in Part I of the Second Schedule or animals listed in Part II thereof”.
3. Regulation 10 of the principal regulations is amended by the addition immediately before the end thereof of the following new sub-regulations — Amendment of reg. 10 of the principal regulations
 - “(3) Any member, or his authorized agent, who has killed such wild animal, shall surrender to a Chief’s representative, member of the

Botswana Police Force, member of the Department of Wildlife and National Parks or any District Councillor as soon as possible after the killing, the skin or trophy of the animal so killed together with a statement in writing signed by the said member setting out the circumstances surrounding the killing, and the person to whom it has been surrendered shall, within 7 days, forward such skin or trophy and the member's written statement to the Chief. If the Chief to whom it has been forwarded is satisfied, after consultation with the Game Warden, Maun, by the statement given and if he considers it just and equitable in the circumstances, he may issue to such member a written authority to sell such skin or trophy. Any skin or trophy of an animal destroyed or killed in accordance with this regulation which is not so surrendered as soon as possible after the killing, or any skin or trophy which has been surrendered and in respect of which the Chief to whom it has been forwarded has not issued a written authority to sell shall be deemed to be the property of the District Council.

(4) Any person who fails to surrender to a Chief's representative, member of the Botswana Police Force, member of the Department of Wildlife and National Parks or District Councillor as soon as possible a skin or trophy of an animal killed under this regulation or any person who sells or attempts to sell a skin or trophy of an animal so killed without written authority under subregulation (3) shall be guilty of an offence."

4. Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is amended by the addition, immediately before the end thereof of the following new sub-regulations —

"(3) Any member, or his authorized agent, who has killed the wild animal shall surrender to a Chief's representative, member of the Botswana Police Force, member of the Department of Wildlife and National Parks or District Councillor as soon as possible after the killing, the skin or trophy of the animal so killed together with a statement in writing signed by the said member setting out the circumstances surrounding the killing of such wild animal, and the person to whom it has been surrendered shall, within 7 days, forward such skin or trophy and the member's written statement to the Chief. If the Chief to whom such statement is given is satisfied, after consultation with the Game Warden, Maun, by it and if such person considers it just and equitable in the circumstances he may issue to such member a written authority to sell such skin or trophy. Any skin or trophy of an animal destroyed or killed in accordance with this regulation which is not so surrendered as soon as possible after the killing, or any skin or trophy which has been surrendered and in respect of

which the Chief to whom it has been produced has not issued a written authority to sell shall be deemed to be the property of the District Council.

(4) Any person who fails to surrender to a Chief's representative, member of the Botswana Police Force, member of the Department of Wildlife and National Parks or District Councillor as soon as possible a skin or trophy of an animal killed under this regulation or any person who sells or attempts to sell a skin or trophy of an animal so killed without written authority under subregulation (3) shall be guilty of an offence."

5. The principal regulations are amended by the addition immediately after regulation 12E of the following new regulation —

12F. No member shall export the meat of any animal or game killed under these regulations other than in the hunting season in which it has been killed and unless he is in possession of a current and valid licence in the form in the Fourth Schedule hereto. Any licence issued under this regulation shall not permit the export by any member of game or animal meat in excess of 110 kilograms per annum and shall stipulate that any meat so exported under the licence shall be exported at one and the same time."

6. The First Schedule to the principal regulations is amended by —

(i) in Part I the addition immediately after "Roan Antelope" of the following —

"Waterbuck (Letimoga)"; and

(ii) by the deletion of Part II and the substitution therefor of the following new Part —

In terms of regulation 12F of the Fauna Conservation (Batawana Tribal Territory) Hunting Regulations, 1967 (S.I. 65/1967) permission is hereby granted to:

dated _____ and issued in terms of regulation 5 to export, to a maximum of 110 (one hundred and ten) kilograms (242 (two hundred and forty two) pounds), meat of animals or game killed in terms of the above licence since the 15th of March last, from Batawana Tribal Territory.

In terms of Regulation 12F, the exportation of the meat must take place at one and the same time; there can be no subsequent exportation of meat under this permit, nor may a subsequent permit be issued in respect of the holder of this permit during the current hunting season. Possession of this permit shall in no way exempt the holder of the permit from complying

with any other regulations which from time to time may be in force in respect of the movement of animal products including meat out of the Batawana Tribal Territory or out of Botswana.
