LOCAL GOVERNMENT (DISTRICT COUNCILS) LAW
(35 of 1965)

KWENENG DISTRICT (BRICKMAKERS' LICENSING) BYE-LAWS, 1971

(Published on the 5th February, 1971)

In exercise of the powers vested in it by section 31 of the Local Government (District Councils) Law, 1965, the Kweneng District Council has made the following bye-laws —

- 1.** These bye-laws may be cited as the Kweneng District (Brickmakers' Licensing) Bye-Laws, 1971, and shall apply within the area of jurisdiction of the Kweneng District Council. Citation and application
- 2.** In these bye-laws unless inconsistent with the context — Interpretation.
“Council” means the Kweneng District Council;
“Council Officer” means the Council Secretary, the Council Treasurer or any revenue officer of the Council;
“district” means the area for which the Council has been established;
“licensing officer” means a revenue officer of the Council.
- 3.** (1) Subject to bye-law 4, no person shall carry on a business of brickmaking in the district unless he is the holder of a current brickmakers' licence. Licensing of brickmakers
- (2) A brickmaker's licence shall be issued on application by a licensing officer on payment of the fee hereinafter prescribed.
- (3) Such licence shall be issued in respect of a twelve month period commencing on 1st January in any year and terminating on 31st December of the same year on payment of a fee of R10.
- (4) A licensing officer on being satisfied that a licence issued by the Council has been lost, damaged or destroyed shall issue to the person to whom such licence was originally issued a duplicate licence on payment of a fee of 50 cents.
- (5) A licence shall not be transferable.
- (6) Every holder of a brickmakers' licence shall produce his licence for inspection on demand by any Police or Council Officer.
- 4.** (1) These bye-laws shall not apply to any employee of the Council whilst employed by the Council as a brickmaker and engaged in such employment. Exemption.

(2) The Council may, in writing, exempt any person from the provisions of these bye-laws for such period as it may determine.

Penalty. 5. (1) Any person who contravenes bye-law 3(1) shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of R20 or, in default of payment, to imprisonment for two months.

(2) Any person who contravenes bye-law 3(6) shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of R10 or, in default of payment, to imprisonment for one month.
