**FOOT AND MOUTH CONTROL REGULATIONS, 1972**

*(Published on the 19th May, 1972)*

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 2 of the Stock Diseases Proclamation, His Excellency the President has made the following regulations —

- Citation           **1.** These regulations may be cited as the Foot and Mouth Control Regulations, 1972.
- Vaccination of animals   **2.** (1) All cattle, sheep and goats within the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be vaccinated against foot and mouth disease at intervals of not less than twelve months.
- (2) Any person who owns or is in charge of any cattle, sheep or goats which have not been vaccinated in accordance with subregulation (1) shall, in respect of each such animal not vaccinated, be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of R25 and to imprisonment for two weeks.
- Power to order vaccination   **3.** (1) When, in the opinion of the Director of Veterinary Services or any person duly authorised by him, it is in the interest of the control of foot and mouth disease that any cattle, sheep or goats within the area described in the Schedule hereto be vaccinated, then, whether or not such animal has been vaccinated within the previous twelve months, the Director or such duly authorised person shall have power to direct the vaccination or re-vaccination of such animal.
- (2) Any person who refuses to comply with a direction under subregulation (1) or who obstructs any duly authorised officer attempting to carry out such a direction shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of R50 and to imprisonment for one month.

*SCHEDULE*

From a point on the Botswana/S.W. African boundary 30 miles south of the junction of the Ngamiland Veterinary Control fence with the said border at south Latitude 21°, thence northwards along the international

boundary, thence eastwards along the international boundary between Botswana and the Caprivi Strip as far as the confluence of the Chobe and Zambesi Rivers, thence south eastwards along the international boundary between Botswana and Rhodesia, to a point at approximately south Latitude  $20^{\circ} 20'$  that is a straight line distance of 20 miles from the junction of the Dukwe fence with the international boundary, thence in a westerly direction along an arc of a circle of radius 20 miles and centre at the aforesaid fence junction, to a point where this arc meets the Dukwe fence, thence in a south westerly direction along the Dukwe fence to a point where an extension of the fence would meet the Lephephe/Makalamabedi fence, thence in a north-westerly direction along this fence to the junction with the Ngamiland Veterinary Control fence in S. Latitude  $21^{\circ}$ , thence in a westerly direction along this fence, thence in a southerly direction for 30 miles along the western boundary of the Central Kalahari Game Reserve, thence westwards to the starting point, as is more fully shown on Plan BP 166 in the office of the Director of Surveys and Lands.
