REGULATION OF WAGES AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT ACT, 1969
(22 of 1969)

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Regulation of Wages and Conditions of Employment Act, 1969, the Minister of Health, Labour and Home Affairs hereby makes the following Order —

**THE REGULATION OF WAGES (MANUFACTURING TRADES
WAGES COUNCIL ESTABLISHMENT) ORDER, 1973**

1. This Order may be cited as the Regulation of Wages (Manufacturing Trades Wages Council Establishment) Order, 1973.

2. There is hereby established a Wages Council (to be known and hereinafter referred to as the Manufacturing Trades Wages Council) to perform, in relation to the employees specified in the Schedule to this Order, the powers and functions specified in that behalf in the Act.

3. The Manufacturing Trades Wages Council shall consist, as to independent members, of a Chairman, a Deputy Chairman and one other, and, as to representative members, of not more than two persons to represent employers, and not more than two persons to represent employees.

SCHEDULE

All persons employed in any undertaking or part of an undertaking which consists of the manufacture, for gain, of any item whether from raw materials or from partially processed materials, and whether for sale to the wholesale or retail trades, or for sale to other manufacturers:

Provided that persons employed in an undertaking or part of an undertaking —
(i) in any trade affected by any other Wages Council Order made under the Act; or
(ii) which is operated by the Government,
shall be excluded.
