**An Act to amend the House of Chiefs (Salaries and Allowances) Act, 1967**

ENACTED by the Parliament of Botswana.

**1.** This Act may be cited as the House of Chiefs (Salaries and Allowances) (Amendment) Act, 1974.

Short title and commencement

**2.** Section 3 of the House of Chiefs (Salaries and Allowances) Act, 1967, hereinafter referred to as the principal Act, is amended by substituting for the words "six hundred", which appear therein, the words "seven hundred and twenty".

Amendment of section 3 of Act 17 of 1967.

**3.** Section 4 (1) of the principal Act is amended by substituting for the word "five", which appears therein, the word "six".

Amendment of section 4 of principal Act

**4.** Paragraph 1 of the Schedule to the principal Act is amended by substituting for the word "six", which appears therein, the word "fifteen".

**5.** Paragraph 2 (2) (a) of the Schedule to the principal Act is amended by substituting for the words "12 cents a mile", which appear therein, the words "10 cents per kilometre".

**6.** The Schedule to the principal Act is amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph as follows —

“Termination  
allowance” 4. (1) Subject to the provisions of subparagraph (2), a member, other than one who is in receipt of other emoluments from public funds exceeding in amount the salary payable to him under this Act, shall, on ceasing to be a member, receive a termination allowance at the rate of twenty per centum of the aggregate basic salary drawn by him while he was a member.

(2) There shall be deducted from the terminal allowance payable to a member any sums due to Government.”.
