**IMMIGRATION (CONSOLIDATION) (EXEMPTION) ORDER, 1974**

*(Published on the 3rd May, 1974)*

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by sections 19 and 6 of the Immigration (Consolidation) Law, 1966, the Minister of Health, Labour and Home Affairs hereby makes the following Order —

1. This Order may be cited as the Immigration (Consolidation) (Exemption) Order, 1974. Citation
2. The members of the classes of persons named in the First Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from complying with the provisions of section 6 of the Law. Members of a class of persons exempt from presenting themselves to an immigration officer
3. The members of the classes of persons named in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby exempted from obtaining a residence permit to reside in Botswana. Members of a class of persons exempt from obtaining a residence permit
4. Statutory Instruments Numbers 31 of 1965, 31 of 1967, 84 of 1968, 25 of 1970, 52 of 1970 and 85 of 1970 are hereby revoked. Revocation

**FIRST SCHEDULE**

(1) Clients of undermentioned safari companies who arrive in Botswana by air for a temporary period at a place where no immigration officer is permanently stationed —

- (a) Ker Downey Safaris (Bechuanaland) (Pty) Ltd.
- (b) Zambezi Safari (Pty) Ltd.
- (c) Bechuanaland Hunter (Pty) Ltd.
- (d) White Hunters (Africa) Ltd.
- (e) Mitch Spencer Safaris
- (f) Safari South (Pty) Ltd.
- (g) Bamangwato Safaris (Pty) Ltd.
- (h) Kalahari Tours and Safaris (Bechuanaland) (Pty) Ltd.

(2) Any person employed by —

- (a) the Department of Surveyor-General of Rhodesia; and
  - (b) the Trigonometrical Survey of the Republic of South Africa;
- whilst engaged on surveying duties provided —

they are in possession of valid passports or certificates of indenture;  
and

(i) they are in possession of valid passports or certificates of identity;  
and

(ii) their names have, prior to entry, been notified by the government concerned to the Immigration Control Officer and these names appear on a list kept by the officer.

(3) Any person employed by Rhodesia Railways as a member of a train crew or dining car staff while travelling on duty between Rhodesia and Botswana, provided he is in possession of a valid passport or a certificate of identity in a form approved by the Minister of Health, Labour and Home Affairs.
