**ESSENTIAL SUPPLIES (PETROL) REGULATIONS, 1975**

(Published on the 25th July, 1975)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Essential Supplies and Services Act, 1973, His Excellency the President hereby makes the following Regulations

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Essential Supplies (Petrol) Regulations, 1975. Citation

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, -- Inter-pretation  
"petrol" includes any mixture of petrol with any other substance capable of being used as a fuel in internal combustion engines,;

"re-seller" means a person who operates a shop or other premises in respect of which a petrol filling station licence has been issued under the Trading Act, 1966. 6 of 1966

3. (1) No re-seller of petrol with premises situate within the areas specified in the Schedule shall sell or in any other way whatsoever dispose of petrol in his possession or under his control other than on the following days and between the following hours — Restriction on hours for sale of petrol

(a) on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.;

(b) on Saturdays, between the hours of 6 a.m. and 1 p.m.; and

(c) on Sundays, between the hours of 12 noon and 6 p.m.

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of R2 000 and to imprisonment for one year.

4. (1) Without prejudice to the provisions of the Road Traffic (Speed Limits for Specified Vehicles) Regulations, 1974, imposing a lower speed on vehicles specified therein, no person shall drive or permit to be driven any motor vehicle upon any public road at a speed exceeding 90 kilometres per hour. Speed limit S.I. 148 of 1974

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of R2 000 and to imprisonment for one year.

5. The Essential Supplies (Petrol) Regulations, 1973, are hereby revoked. Revocation of S.I. 100 of 1973

SCHEDULE

(reg. 3 (1))

1. The area within 80 kilometres of the railway line running between Ramatlabama and Vakaranga.

2. The area within 80 kilometres of the railway line running between Serule and Selebi-Pikwe.
