IMMIGRATION (CONSOLIDATION) LAW, 1966
(19 of 1966)

IMMIGRATION (CONSOLIDATION) (EXEMPTION) ORDER, 1975

(Published on the 7th March, 1975)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by sections 6 and 19 of the Immigration (Consolidation) Law, 1966, the Minister of Home Affairs hereby makes the following Order –

1. This Order may be cited as the Immigration (Consolidation) (Exemption) Order, 1975. Citation

2. Members of the classes of persons named in the First Schedule are exempted from complying with the provisions of section 6 of the Law, provided they are in possession of valid passports or certificates of identity. Persons exempt from presenting themselves to an immigration officer

3. Members of the classes of persons named in the Second Schedule are hereby exempted from obtaining a residence permit to reside in Botswana, provided they are in possession of valid passports or certificates of identity. Persons exempt from obtaining a residence permit

4. The Immigration (Consolidation) (Exemption) Order, 1974, is revoked. Revocation of S.I. 62 of 1974

FIRST SCHEDULE

1. Clients of the undermentioned safari companies who arrive in Botswana by air for a temporary period at a place where no immigration officer is permanently stationed –

- (a) Ker Downey Safaris (Bechuanaland) (Pty.) Ltd.
- (b) Zambezi Safari (Pty.) Ltd.
- (c) Bechuanaland Hunter (Pty.) Ltd.
- (d) White Hunters (Africa) Ltd.
- (e) Mitch Spencer Safaris;
- (f) Safari South (Pty.) Ltd.;
- (g) Bamangwato Safaris (Pty.) Ltd.;
- (h) Kalahari Tours and Safaris (Bechuanaland) (Pty.) Ltd.

2. Any person employed by –

- (a) the Department of Surveyor-General of Rhodesia; and
- (b) the Trigonometrical Survey of the Republic of South Africa, whilst engaged on surveying duties.

3. Any person employed by Rhodesia Railways as a member of a train crew or dining car staff while travelling on duty between Rhodesia and Botswana.

 - (l) International Atomic Energy Agency;
 - (m) Universal Postal Union;
 - (n) International Governmental Maritime Consultative Organisation;
 - (o) International Bank for Reconstruction and Development;
 - (p) International Monetary Fund;
 - (q) International Development Association;
 - (r) United Nations Association;
 - (s) Canadian University Service Overseas.
9. Persons recruited for service in Botswana as members of the Botswana Teaching Service by –
