ARRANGEMENT OF REGULATIONS

SCHEDULE

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Essential Supplies and Services Act, 1973, His Excellency the President hereby makes the following Regulations —

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Essential Supplies (Petrol) Regulations, 1979. Citation
2. In these Regulations — Interpretation
“petrol” includes any mixture of petrol with any other substance capable of being used as a fuel in internal combustion engines;
“re-seller of petrol” means a person who operates premises in respect of which a petrol filling station licence has been issued under the Trading Act.
3. (1) No re-seller of petrol with premises situated within an area specified in the Schedule shall sell or in any other way whatsoever dispose of petrol in his possession or under his control at, in or from those premises other than — Restriction of hours of Sale of petrol
 - (a) between 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on any day other than a Saturday or Sunday;
 - (b) between 7.00 a.m. and 1.00 p.m. on any Saturday; or
 - (c) between 1.00 p.m. and 6.00 p.m. on any Sunday.

(2) Any person who contravenes this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of P2 000 and to imprisonment for 12 months.

SCHEDULE (reg. 3 (1))

1. The area within 80 km of the railway line running between Ramatlabama and Vakaranga.
2. The area within 80 km of the railway line running between Serule and Selebi-Phikwe.
