IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Essential Supplies and Services Act, 1973, His Excellency the President hereby makes the following Regulations —

- Citation 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Essential Supplies (Speed Limit) (Suspension) Regulations, 1979.
- Suspension
of S.I. 37
of 1979 2. The operation of the Essential Supplies (Speed Limit) Regulations, 1979, is suspended in their application to competitors in and officials of the 1979 Total Transkalahari Road Race whilst competing or officiating in that race —
- (a) on the roads specified in the First Schedule between 6 a.m. on 11th May, 1979, and 8 a.m. on 12th May, 1979; and
 - (b) on the roads specified in the Second Schedule between 6 a.m. and 8 p.m. on 12th May, 1979.
