SCHEDULE

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Minister of Home Affairs by section 2 of the Employment of Non-Citizens Act, 1981, the following Order is hereby made —

1. This Order may be cited as the Non-Citizens (Declaration of No Non-Citizens) (No. 2) Order, 1982. Citation
2. The persons listed in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared not to be non-citizens for the purposes of the Employment of Non-Citizens Act, 1982. Declaration of persons not being non-citizens
3. This Order shall not apply to a spouse or a dependant of any person specified in this Schedule. Non-application of Order
4. The Non-Citizens (Declaration of No Non-Citizens) Order, 1982, is hereby revoked. Revocation of S.I. 63 of 1982

 - (g) United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation
 - (h) World Meteorological Organisation;
 - (i) World Health Organisation;
 - (j) International Civil Aviation Organisation;
 - (k) International Telecommunication Union;
 - (l) International Atomic Energy Agency
 - (m) Universal Postal Union;
 - (n) International Government Maritime Consultative Organisation;
 - (o) International Bank for Reconstruction and Development;

 - (f) Royal Danish Volunteer Service;
 - (g) Norwegian Agency for International Development;
 - (i) German Volunteer Service;
16. Members of the Clergy of the ranks of Bishops, Archbishops and above, of all registered and recognised churches.
17. All non-resident directors of companies registered or incorporated in Botswana.
18. Persons recruited abroad for service in Botswana by the United Nations Commissioner for Namibia.
