ARRANGEMENT OF PARAGRAPHS

PARAGRAPH

1. Comportment of strangers admitted to precincts of the Assembly
2. Penalties

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Speaker of the National Assembly by section 7 of the National Assembly (Powers and Privileges) Act, the following Order is hereby made —

1. No stranger admitted to the precincts of the Assembly shall during the course of any proceedings of the Assembly —
 - (a) cheer, jeer, clap hands, pass remarks, do or say anything which is likely to disturb Members or is likely to interfere with the proceedings of the Assembly;
 - (b) read any book or newspaper;
 - (c) take any pictures;
 - (d) tape record the proceedings of the Assembly.

Comportment of strangers admitted to precincts of the Assembly
2. Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of paragraph 1 shall be guilty of an offence and on conviction thereof he shall be liable to the penalty specified in section 18 of the Act.
