

SCHEDULE

An Act to re-enact with amendments the House of Chiefs (Salaries and Allowances) Act

Date of Assent: 12.8.86

Date of Commencement: 1.4.86

ENACTED by the Parliament of Botswana.

1. This Act may be cited as the House of Chiefs (Salaries and Allowances) Act, 1986, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st April, 1986.

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, —

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the House;

“House” means the House of Chiefs.

pretation

3. The Chairman and the Vice-Chairman shall be paid from moneys appropriated by law for such purpose a salary at the rate of P3 744 and P3 372 respectively a year.

4. (1) Every Member who has taken his seat in the House shall be paid from moneys appropriated by law for such purpose a salary at the rate of P2 820 a year.

Salary of
Members

(2) If a Member is absent from any sitting of the House such salary shall not be paid in respect of the period commencing on

the day of such absence and terminating immediately before the day on which he next attends a sitting of the House.

(3) For the purposes of the preceding subsection a Member who is absent from any sitting of the House with the leave of the Chairman shall be deemed to have attended such sitting.

5. The Chairman and Members shall be paid from moneys appropriated by law for such purpose the allowances prescribed in the Schedule.

6. The allowances payable in terms of this Act shall be exempt from income tax.

7. The House of Chiefs (Salaries and Allowances) Act is hereby repealed.

SCHEDULE

(s. 5)

Subsistence
allowance

1. The Chairman and any Member shall receive an allowance at the rate of P60 for every day or part thereof exceeding four hours that he is necessarily absent from home in attending any meeting of the House or any committee thereof.

Transport
allowance

2. (1) The Chairman and any Member shall receive an allowance, calculated in accordance with the provisions of subparagraph (2), in respect of one return journey undertaken by him by the shortest route in his own motor vehicle or by any public road, rail or air service —

(a) from his home to any meeting of the House, or of any committee thereof of which he is a member held while the House is not sitting; and

(b) from any such meeting to his home during any adjournment of such meeting of three clear days or longer.

(2) Such allowance shall be —

(a) where the journey or part thereof is performed in the Member's own motor vehicle, at the rate for the time being applicable to public officers;

(b) where the journey or any part thereof is performed by any public road, rail or air service, a sum equal to the fare actually paid up to a maximum of the ordinary first class fare payable on such service.

3. Every Member shall receive an allowance of P7 for every sitting of the House during the whole of which he presides in place of the Chairman.

Termination
allowance

4. (1) Subject to the provisions of subparagraph (2), a member, other than one who is in receipt of other emoluments from public funds exceeding in amount the salary payable to him under this Act, shall on ceasing to be a member, receive a termination allowance at the rate of 20 percent of the aggregate basic salary drawn by him while he was a member.

(2) There shall be deducted from the terminal allowance payable to a member any sums due to Government.

5. Every Member shall receive an entertainment allowance at the rate of P50, together with a subsistence allowance at rates payable to public officers, for every day or part thereof that he is necessarily absent from Botswana attending a conference, seminar or similar function approved by the President.

6. The Chairman shall receive an entertainment allowance at the rate of P1 200 per annum which shall be in addition to any entertainment allowance to which he may be entitled by virtue of paragraph 5.
