(No. 30 of 1986)

**TRADE AND LIQUOR LICENCES (EXTENSION OF PERIOD OF
DURATION) ORDER, 1987**

(Published on 9th January, 1987)

WHEREAS the new Trade Liquor Act which was enacted by Parliament came into force on 31st December, 1986;

AND WHEREAS by virtue of the enactment of the said Trade and Liquor Act certain trade and liquor licences granted under the Trading and Liquor Acts have been revoked by the said Trade and Liquor Act;

AND WHEREAS it is considered not in the public interest for such licences to be revoked in as much as such revocation is likely to cause a great deal of hardship and inconvenience to the trade and liquor licencees;

AND WHEREAS it is provided under section 52 of the said Trade and Liquor Act that the Minister may exempt any person from the provisions of the said Act if in the opinion of the Minister it is desirable in the interest of the public or of any section of the public that such exemption should be granted;

NOW THEREFORE in exercise of the powers conferred on the Minister of Commerce and Industry by section 52 of the said Trade and Liquor Act, all trade and liquor licences granted under the repealed Trading and Liquor Acts are hereby extended for a period of two months as if granted under the new Act.

This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st January, 1987.
