IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Minister of Commerce and Industry by section 52 of the Trade and Liquor Act, 1986, the following Regulations are hereby made —

- Citation        1. These Regulations may be cited as the Trade and Liquor Licensing (Exemption) Regulations, 1987.
- Exemption Licence    2. Those persons named in the First Schedule hereto may be granted a licence in the form set out in the Second Schedule permitting them access to wholesalers for the purchase of the items set out in the said licence.

- 3. Market gardeners
- 4. Dairy owners
- 5. Construction companies registered under the Companies Act or Business Names Act
- 6. Private primary and secondary schools
- 7. Day care centres

- 9. Private Hospitals and Clinics
