**TRADE AND LIQUOR (LOCAL LICENSING AUTHORITIES)
REGULATIONS, 1991
(Published on 22nd February, 1991)**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 35(2) of the Trade and Liquor Act, the Minister of Commerce and Industry hereby makes the following Regulations —

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Trade and Liquor (Local Licensing Authorities) Regulations, 1991. Citation

2. (1) Any Local Licensing Authority may co-opt the following persons, or such of them as it considers necessary or advisable, to advise it in the exercise of its functions under the Act — Persons who
may be
co-opted
to advise
Local
Licensing
Authorities

- (a) the District Commissioner;
- (b) the Officer Commanding Police;
- (c) the Immigration Officer;
- (d) the Secretary of the Land Board;
- (e) the Health Inspector;
- (f) the Integrated Field Services Officer;
- (g) the Physical Planner;
- (h) one person to represent consumer interests; and
- (i) one person to represent the interests of traders

(2) The persons referred to in subregulation (1) by virtue of the posts they hold shall be such persons as hold those posts in the area for which the Local Licensing Authority concerned is responsible, and where any such person is unable to attend any meeting of the Authority he is asked to attend, he may nominate an officer subordinate to him to represent him at that meeting.
