“PART I

Blazon of the Arms or Ensigns Armorial of Botswana

Argent three barrulets wavy in fesse Botswana blue between in chief three Botswana blue cogwheels, one above engaged with two below and in base a brown bull’s head caboshed proper, and for the supporters on either side a zebra the dexter supporting a white elephant’s tusk the sinister a green stalk of sorghum and brown sorghum head with white grains proper. Motto “Pula” in black on a Botswana blue half tone scroll. The reverse side of the scroll is red.”; and

- (b) by substituting, for the words “azure blue”, wherever they appear in the Schedule, the words “Botswana blue”.
