1. This Order may be cited as the Regulation of Minimum Wages Order, 2006, and shall come into force on 1st May, 2006.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of —

- (i) the Regulation of Wages (Building, Construction, Exploration and Quarrying Industries) Order;
- (ii) the Regulation of Wages (Wholesale and Retail Distributive Trades) Order;
- (iii) the Regulation of Wages (Manufacturing, Service and Repair Trades) Order;
- (iv) the Regulation of Wages (Hotel, Catering and Entertainment Trades) Order; and
- (v) the Regulation of Wages (Garage, Motor Trade and Road Transport) Order,

the basic minimum wages to be paid to employees in the trades or industries listed herein shall be as indicated in relation thereto, and the above mentioned Orders shall be deemed to be amended accordingly —

<i>Trade or Industry</i>	<i>Basic Minimum Wage</i>
(a) (i) Building, Construction, Exploration and Quarrying Industries;	P3.35 per hour
(ii) Wholesale Distributive Trade;	P3.35 per hour
(iii) Manufacturing, Service and Repair Trades;	P3.35 per hour
(iv) Hotel, Catering and Entertainment Trades;	P3.35 per hour
(v) Garage, Motor Trade and Road Transport;	2.90 per hour
(b) Retail Distributive Trade;	
(c) Security Guards employed by Security Guard Companies;	3.35 per hour
(d) Nightwatchmen in the above trades/industries;	2.80 per hour

3. The Minimum Wages Order, 2005 is hereby revoked.
