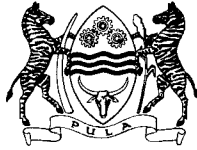

The sum authorised by section 2 shall be appropriated to and applied for, the Heads (Organisations) of Expenditure set out in the first and second columns of the Schedule, in the amounts set out in the corresponding entries in the third column of the said Schedule.</p> | Appropriation of sum authorised by section 2 |
| <p>4. The Minister of Finance and Economic Development may issue a warrant for the payment from the Development Fund for the year ending 31st March, 2019 of the sum of P19,306,333,840 (Nineteen Billion, Three Hundred and Six Million, Three Hundred and Thirty-Three Thousand, Eight Hundred and Forty Pula).</p> | Expenditure from Development Fund |
