NOTICE.

ENEMY DEBTS.

With reference to the Treaty of Peace Order (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation, 1920 (No. 26 of 1920), information has now been received from the Secretary of State that, under paragraph 5 of the Annex to Article 296 of the Treaty of Peace with Germany, which Article and Annex were published in the *High Commissioner's Gazette* on the 4th June under Notice No. 50 of the 27th May, 1920, it is necessary that notice should be given of all British claims covered by that Article (within six months of the establishment of the Central Clearing Office in London that is) before 12th July, 1920.

All persons in the Bechuanaland Protectorate who wish to give notice of any claims under Article 296 of the Treaty of Peace with Germany, either against Germans resident in Germany or against the German Government, are therefore hereby warned to give such notice forthwith to the local Clearing Office at Mafeking.

The officer in charge of the local Clearing Office will, on application, provide the necessary form on which particulars of claims should be entered and supply information as to the evidence required in support of claims.
