PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

Entitled the "Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation, 1920."

Whereas by the Treaty of Peace Order (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation 1920 the Treaty of Peace Order 1919 was modified in certain respects in its application to the Bechuanaland Protectorate (herein after referred to as "the territory");

And whereas it is expedient to modify in certain respects the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order 1920 in its application to the territory;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. The Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order 1920 (herein after referred to as "the Amendment Order") shall in its application to the territory be subject to the following modifications, that is to say—

(a) in article *two* of the Amendment Order and in all the amendments contained in the Schedule to the Amendment Order with the exception of the new paragraph XIV A inserted after paragraph XIV in article *one* of the Treaty of Peace Order 1919, wherever the words "the Board of Trade" or "the President of the Board of Trade" occur, the words "the High Commissioner for South Africa" shall be substituted therefor;

(b) for the purpose of the additional sub-paragraph (*aa*) contained in the Schedule to the Amendment Order and inserted in article *one* (XVII) of the Treaty of Peace Order 1919 "the Court" shall mean the Special Court of the Bechuanaland Protectorate;

(c) the amendment of article *one* (XVII) (*d*) of the Treaty of Peace Order 1919 contained in the Schedule to the Amendment Order shall not have effect.

2. This Proclamation may be cited for all purposes as the "Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation 1920" and each of the modifications of the Amendment Order made by this Proclamation shall be deemed to have come into operation on the date when the provision of the Amendment Order affected thereby came into operation.
