PROCLAMATION

By His Royal Highness the High Commissioner.

Further amending the Bechuanaland Protectorate Enemy Property and Trade Regulation Proclamation, 1916, in respect of property vested in the Custodian of Enemy Property.

Whereas it is expedient further to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Enemy Property and Trade Regulation Proclamation 1916 (herein after referred to as "the said Proclamation");

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Where any property has been vested in the Custodian of Enemy Property under the provisions of the said Proclamation it shall be lawful for the High Commissioner to confer upon the Custodian such powers of selling managing and otherwise dealing with such property as the High Commissioner may think fit, and any such powers conferred upon the Custodian under this Proclamation shall be in substitution for or supplemental to any such powers conferred upon the Custodian by order of the Special Court of the Bechuanaland Protectorate as the High Commissioner may by his order conferring such powers prescribe.

2. This Proclamation shall be read as one with the said Proclamation and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
