PROCLAMATION.

BY

HIS EXCELLENCY SIR HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, &c., &c.

DATED 22nd DECEMBER, 1892.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient, for the purposes of the Proclamation of the High Commissioner for South Africa, dated the 4th day of April, 1892, in so far as the said Proclamation relates to the selling, exchanging, or giving to or procuring for any native any intoxicating liquor, to extend the meaning of the terms "spirituous liquor" and "intoxicating liquor" so as to include "Eau de Cologne":

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers, authorities and jurisdiction conferred upon and committed to me by Her Majesty, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and make known as follows:—

Eau de Cologne included in the terms "spirituous liquor" and "intoxicating liquor."

1. For the purposes of the Proclamation of the High Commissioner for South Africa, dated the 4th day of April, 1892, in so far as the said Proclamation relates to the selling, exchanging, or giving to or procuring for any native any intoxicating liquor, the terms "spirituous liquor" and "intoxicating liquor" shall from and after the date hereof be deemed and taken to include "Eau de Cologne."

Limits of the Proclamation.

2. The operation of this Proclamation is limited to the Bechuanaland Protectorate.¹
