

PROCLAMATION.

DATED 15th JULY, 1893.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to empower the holders of regimental canteen licences issued under the provisions of my Proclamation of the 4th day of April, 1892, during the currency of such licence, to trade within the

PROCLAMATIONS.

Bechuanaland Protectorate, with members of any Police Force lawfully established in the Bechuanaland Protectorate, without taking out and possessing the licence required by Section 23 of my Proclamation of the 10th day of June, 1891, and also to deal in gunpowder within the said Protectorate with the said members without taking out and possessing the licence required by Tariff 15 of Schedule 2 to the Stamp and Offices Fees Act, 1884;^{1, 2}

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers, authorities and jurisdiction conferred upon and committed to me by Her Majesty, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and make known as follows:—

Regimental Canteens may trade with and sell gun-powder to members of Police Force without a licence.

1. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in my Proclamation of the 10th day of June, 1891, the Stamp Act, 1870, and the Stamp and Office Fees Act, 1884, it shall be lawful for the holders of regimental canteen licences issued under the provisions of my Proclamation of the 4th day of April, 1892, to trade within the Bechuanaland Protectorate with members of any Police Force lawfully established in the Bechuanaland Protectorate, without having previously obtained the licence required by Section 23 of my Proclamation of the 10th day of June aforesaid, and also to deal in gunpowder within the said Protectorate with the said members without having previously obtained the licence required by the Stamp and Office Fees Act, 1884.^{1, 2}

Penalty for trading with persons not members of the Police Force.

2. Any holder of such regimental canteen licence as aforesaid, who shall trade as aforesaid or deal in gunpowder as aforesaid, with any person not being a member of any Police Force lawfully established in the Bechuanaland Protectorate, without having previously taken out the particular licence required by law, for the performance of either of such acts, shall be guilty of contravening Section 30 of my Proclamation of the 10th day of June, aforesaid, or Section 6 of the Stamp Act, 1870, as amended by the Stamp and Office Fees Act, 1884, as the case may be, and shall be liable to the penalty provided in such Proclamation or Act as the case may be for a contravention thereof.¹
